William K. Mahoney is the President and CEO of Skaggs Regional Medical Center. Prior to coming to Branson, Mr. Mahoney served as President and CEO of Labette Health in Parsons, Kansas for five and a half years. While at Labette Health, Mr. Mahoney and his team created the only Rural Diabetes Center in the United States. During his time there, Labette Health also became the state's only level-three trauma center, opened up an eCare program for ICU which resulted in less mortality, and lowered employee turnover below six percent. Mr. Mahoney received his Master's Degree in Health Administration from the University of Missouri in Columbia, Missouri.

Mr. Mahoney will discuss the steps that, from his insiders' view, led to health reform, outline an implementation timeline of how and when the health entities in your community will be affected, and help you become better prepared for the change that is coming.
